WHEREAS, He has served on the faculties of the Engineering Extension of the University of California and California State University, Sacramento, and is the past president of the California Legislative Council of Professional Engineers, a Fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers, and a member of the state Curriculum Development and Supplemental Materials Commission and the American Arbitration Association; and

WHEREAS, A native of New Jersey, Leroy Greene graduated from Purdue University with a degree in civil engineering and headed Leroy F. Greene and Associates, Consulting Engineers, from 1951 to 1978, experience that he has willingly shared with individuals at all levels on school construction, earthquake safety, and related issues; and

WHEREAS, Senator Greene was married to his first wife, Denny Miller Greene, for 50 years, until her death, and this union was enhanced by one daughter, Dennie Maslak, who lives with her husband, Mike, in Chula Vista; and

WHEREAS, Today, he receives the love and support of his wife, Syma Reynolds-Greene; and

WHEREAS, Through his personal, professional, and public achievements, Senator Greene has made a significant impact on the people of the 6th Senatorial District and throughout the state, and he will be sorely missed by those individuals with whom he has been associated; now, therefore, be it
